### 4 types of aid

- 1. FAFSA everyone should submit FAFSA regardless of amount of need: www.FAFSA.gov
- 2. State
- 3. Institutional
- 4. Private

### Types of Grants

- 1. Pell Grant: award based on EFC (expected family contribution from FAFSA)
- 2. Florida Grants
  - a. Florida resident access grant
  - b. Florida student Ass. Grant (need based)
  - c. Bright Futures
    - i. Florida Academic
    - ii. Florida Medallion
- 3. National Merit Finalist
- 4. Self Help
  - a. Federal work study
  - b. Florida work experience program
  - c. Student employment
- 5. Direct Loans: <u>www.studentloans.gov</u>
  - a. Subsidized (interest free need based)
  - b. Unsubsidized (interest and not need based)
