Treasurer's Budget Update - Alison Meyer

 So far we have raised \$57,761 as of end of January, thanks for all of your very generous donations. We have spent \$17,472 on classroom grants, with \$4,000 set aside for an approved but not yet invoiced grant to reach this amount. As of end of January we have \$22,829 available to spend on future grants in the classroom.

 Approved \$2,000 in grants last week, a large percentage of grants have gone to technology that assists in simultaneous teaching, and we have been able to fund almost every request this year. There was one request that was funded through facilities budget instead of foundation.

- I got to see some parents in person last week, and it was amazing. We are hoping to get back to normal and be together in person soon.

- 2,478 Students enrolled, 1,884 are attending brick and mortar, 594 are e-learning. We are the only school doing 100% simultaneous in person and e-learning.
- The Girls basketball team are poised to win a state title. They
 and the boys and girls soccer teams are all doing e-learning in
 advance of their competitions to keep chances of quarantine
 low. Doing simultaneous learning has been the best option for
 all of our students.
- Our teachers are working hard, and it is taking a toll, but our teachers do it because they want to do what is best for our kids. Please be patient and work with our teachers. The e-learning is a lot of extra work, and we are doing everything in our power to make sure it is working
- We almost made it through a week without a Covid case, but picked some up (one Friday and two Monday) and there is a new round of contact tracing quarantines. The students are cooperating really well on campus. We quarantine out of an abundance of caution based on contact tracing, and quarantines must be followed to be careful and as safe as possible.
- Extracurricular is in full swing (safely). If you get a chance to be a part of that please come and take part.

- Our girls cross country won state title as runners and state and district GPA awards for highest combined GPA in the district and the entire state of FL with an unweighted 3.98!
- Girls swimming also won district GPA, Boys football (55 boys) had 3.48 unweighted GPA! Our kids are performing and doing their best.
- We had a basketball game against Jesuit last week and we were allowed 400 attendees. All tickets were used and there was a lot of difficulty keeping people apart, and we tried as hard as we could with three administrators and two police officers on duty.
